## **Evidencing the use of the PE and Sport Premium funding: Action plan 2020-2021**

## The DfE Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium

**All** pupils leaving primary school **physically literate** and with the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.

## The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following objective:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision (above) that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 3 key indicators:

- 1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- 2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils, including swimming
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport

TOTAL FUNDING ALLOCATION: £19,530

Ofsted's new Inspection Framework 2019, gives greater recognition to schools' work to support the personal development of pupils, such as the opportunities they have to learn about eating healthily and maintaining anactive lifestyle. Inspectors will expect to see schools delivering a broad, ambitious education, including opportunities to be active during the school day and through extra-curricular activities. Schools should consider how they use their PE and Sport Premium to support this.
