

PE Sports Premium Funding Allocation 2016-2017 Foxdell Junior School Context of the school:

CONTEXT: Foxdell Junior School is a large junior school with 360 pupils. The majority of pupils within the school are EAL and we have a number of SEN pupils. Predominantly, children are of a Pakistani or Bengali background but there has been an increase in the number of children attending the school originally from Eastern Europe (such as Poland, Hungary, Czechoslovakia, Romania). Sport is highly regarded at Foxdell Junior School and we were a PE specialism pilot school for the Youth Sport Trust where PE was used to drive academic progress. Although the pilot scheme has now come to an end, Foxdell still upholds the values that were implemented during this period and TAs are contracted so that their hours cover running lunch time and after school clubs, meaning that a wide variety of clubs are offered to children. Class teachers are also encouraged to use PE within other curriculum areas to engage children. The school also has a specialist PE instructor who delivers a number of PE lessons across the school but, due to the expansion of the school, some class teachers also deliver PE lessons to classes or team teach with the specialist instructor. The children at Foxdell love taking part in PE lessons and sports based activities. There is an excellent uptake for clubs and there has been an increase in success for the sports teams of the school. Lessons cater for the SEN children within the school and TAs assist during these lessons. Pupil Premium children receive free PE kit.
