English: Darwin's Dragons by Lindsay Galvin This term we will be using our class novel, which is set

in the 19th century and based on Charles Darwin's journey to the Galapagos Islands, as stimulus for writing a suspense story and a balanced argument.

In reading lessons, children will be practising answering comprehension style questions on a wide range of high level texts to prepare them for end of year 6 tests.

History

The children will be learning about the Victorian period in Britain and the interesting inventions they designed during the 1800s. Children will also discuss the similarities and differences between schools and home lives from the Victorian era to the 21st century.

Art: Children will develop their modelling, carving and casting skills to construct a three dimensional memorial box. Children will be able to design their artwork in a way which is personal and meaningful to them using individual designs.

RE

The children will consider what would make our community a more respectful place by considering the range of religions followed in our area.

Music
